It has been a fantastic fall at Gilbert this year! The Gilbert High School won a national award when it was named a Blue Ribbon School. We have also had an outstanding fall sports season. Our Cross Country Boys Team won the first ever State Championship for boys in the Gilbert district. We also have two state champions, Grace Gibbons and Thomas Pollard, and three other runners who finished in the top ten; Carly Rahn, Wes Greder, and Brad Richards. Our local FFA chapter continues to thrive and be a source of pride for the district. They have started a really interesting community garden program that will benefit the community as well as be a great learning tool for students.
